Things to Consider Before Adopting a Hybrid

Commonly Seen Behavior Problems

- Poor litter box habits
- Aggression
- Aversive to people and other pets in home
- High energy
- Other "wild" behaviors

Commonly Seen Health Problems

- IBE
- Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy
- Progressive Retinal Atrophy
- Other health issues due to their hybridization

Keeping A Hybrid Happy and Healthy

- Outlets for wild instincts
 - Enrichment
 - Engaging toys
 - $\circ \quad \text{ Secure outdoor space }$
- Appropriate diet
 - o Many hybrids thrive on a raw diet
- Regular vet checks
 - Find a vet well versed in the health of your hybrid
